- 1. The SON's revised curriculum is resulting in increased NCLEX pass rate success, evidenced by the cohort scores for 2022.
- 2. The NCLEX will change. The first Next Gen NCLEX will be given on April 1, 2023.
- 3. Nursing education is moving to competency-based. The SON is actively developing the CBE curriculum for launch in 2024.

- We are actively working to prepare students and past graduates for NCLEX Next Gen readiness.
