## Textbook \& Instructional Materials Affordability Initiatives

Describe specific initiatives of the institution designed to reduce the costs of textbooks and instructional materials.

Beginning Fall 2022, Florida A\&M University implemented a new cost-savings initiative for undergraduate students called the "Rattler Pack". The "Rattler Pack" is a new option that allows for a more efficient and cost-effective way for students to receive course materials. By choosing the Rattler Pack, students receive all their course materials for only $\$ 24$ per credit hour. With the Rattler Pack, students know for certain that they will receive all required textbooks on or before the first day of class. Overall, they seem to be happy with this new option.

Has the opt-out provision been implemented by your institution for the purchase of student materials? If yes, describe the impact this has this had on student savings, if any.

As of Fall 2022, undergraduate students are automatically enrolled into the Rattler Pack program upon registering for classes. Starting 30-days before classes, students receive an email to verify their order and select fulfillment preferences. Following, an email notification is sent when the order is ready for pickup or when it ships. FAMU has negotiated a rate of $\$ 24$ per credit with the program. Students have been able to realize initial savings with the program of $35-50 \%$ on the cost of required materials each term.

Florida A\&M University students saved $\$ 2,500,728.15$ in Fall 2022 - Spring 2023 using the Rattler Pack. Some of the impact on student outcomes were:

1. $92 \%$ of students said the program saved them time in shopping for course materials because they are all in one place
2. $91 \%$ found it convenient to have their course materials bundled and delivered through the program.
3. $86 \%$ said with this program, they were better prepared for the academic term
4. $83 \%$ felt the program provided them with more affordable course materials
$5.83 \%$ said that the program had a positive impact on their academic success
5. $89 \%$ said they were likely to recommend the program to other students
