Direct Support Organizations (DSO) and Athletics Committee Minutes Trustee Deveron Gibbons, Chair Wednesday, March 6, 2024

Trustee Deveron Gibbons called the meeting to order. Trustees John Crossman, Kelvin Lawson, Belvin Perry, Jr., Nicole Washington and Michael White were in attendance and established a quorum. Trustees Natlie Figgers and Kenny Stone were not in attendance due to previous commitments.

Approval of December 6, 2023, DSO and Athletics Committee Meeting Minutes

Trustee Lawson motioned for approval; seconded by Trustee Perry. The motion passed, unanimously.

Approval of FAMU Foundation Board Action Items

- A. Foundation Bylaws Recommended Amendments
- B. Approval of 2023-2024 Foundation Operating Budget Amendment

Dr. Shawnta Friday-Stroud presented to the Committee consideration for approval the FAMU Foundation Amended Bylaws. The Foundation Bylaws were amended to include term limits for board members beginning January 2024 and thereafter. Foundation Board Directors would be allowed to serve a maximum of three (3) 4-year terms or a total of twelve (12) years.

The Committee discussed this item and Trustee Gibbons referenced the Alexander Haas Consultant Report Recommendations from the Foundation Board's engagement with the firm in 2021. The Committee highlighted recommendations from the report that addressed a review of the Foundation Bylaws, Investment Policy, and Spending Policy. Dr. Friday-Stroud informed the committee that many of the recommendations from the original report had been implemented and that the Foundation General Counsel had reviewed the bylaws and determined they followed applicable SUS guidelines.

Foundation Board Chair LaBoo stated that she requested for the Foundation Bylaws Committee Chair to review the bylaws in comparison with other SUS Foundations to ensure alignment with best practices.

Dr. Friday-Stroud informed the Committee that there would be a Budget and Finance Workshop for the Foundation Board, which the BOT members were also invited, and that the UA Team will include a review of the investments.

A motion was made to approve the Foundation Bylaws recommended amendments. Trustee Lawson motioned for approval; seconded by Trustee White. The motion passed, unanimously.

Next, Dr. Shawnta Friday-Stroud presented to the Committee consideration for approval the of the 2023-2024 Foundation Operating Budget Amendment in the amount of \$700,000 to include \$400,000 for Athletics Summer 2024 scholarships; \$100,000 for the Marching 100 to travel to a Fall 2024 SWAC game; and \$200,000 to cover the costs of approved departmental priority projects identified by the VP/AD.



The Committee discussed this action item, citing the need for a comprehensive Athletics department budget that details all existing sources of revenue and projected expenses, challenging the Rattler Boosters and alums/friends of the University to provide additional support to the Athletics department and formation of a Strategic Board whose charge is to develop a financial sustainability plan for Athletics through multiple years.

Dr. Friday-Stroud stated that she would work with VP/AD Sykes to develop a comprehensive budget that details all inflows and outflows of the department. She also relayed that the Rattler Boosters was still in its infancy, having only been recertified as a Direct Support Organization in 2018, and still needs time to develop infrastructure to provide enhanced support. Trustee Harper stated that she would be creating a special ad-hoc committee to construct a plan to address the long-term fiscal sustainability of the Athletics department.

A motion was made to approve the 2023-2024 Foundation Operating Budget Amendment in the amount of \$700,000 to include \$400,000 for Athletics Summer 2024 scholarships; \$100,000 for the Marching 100 to travel to a Fall 2024 SWAC game; and \$200,000 to cover the costs of approved departmental priority projects identified by the VP/AD. Trustee Perry motioned for approval; seconded by Trustee White. The motion passed, unanimously.

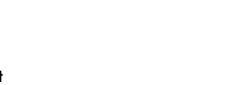
