

### Today's Meeting | School of Allied Health Sciences (Doctor of Physical Therapy)

### **Key Highlights:**

- 1. The Doctor of Physical Therapy program continues to maintain admission criteria for incoming cohorts that align with other DPT programs in the SUS. The program has enhanced the admission process with the addition of interviews.
- 2. The Doctor of Physical Therapy program has undertaken curricular changes inclusive of re-mapping aimed at improving mastery of professional standards and instituted additional national board preparatory experiences for all cohorts.

### **Key Takeaways:**

- The Doctor of Physical Therapy curriculum is now better aligned with the other SUS DPT programs.
- The Doctor of Physical Therapy program has embedded national board preparatory within the curriculum aimed at improving first-time pass rate.
- The School of Allied Health Sciences continues to provide professional development of faculty in the DPT program. The program currently has 3 open faculty lines, and there is a significant need for funds to recruit and retain qualified faculty to teach in the core curriculum.
- The Doctor of Physical Therapy program increased bootcamp opportunities for recent and former graduates to assist in test pass rate.
