WHEN YOU ARRIVE

SAFETY

Florida A&M University (FAMU) Housing has adopted the position that there is no COVID testing or vaccination requirement to live on campus. Due to the broad availability of COVID vaccines and personal protective items, i.e. face coverings, etc., like other State University System (SUS) institutions, FAMU is no longer offering COVID isolation spaces for students who test positive. The University does not have the capacity or available space to accommodate isolation or quarantine.

Effective Fall 2022, students who test positive for COVID are permitted to isolate themselves in their residence hall room, regardless of whether they have a roommate or not. Students always have the choice to isolate off-campus; however, they are not required to do so.

Students should contact the Student Health Center for information about medical services available on campus, including COVID testing and vaccines. Students are encouraged to follow CDC COVID-19 Community Levels (COVID-19 Community Levels (COVID-19 Community Levels | CDC) and their guidance for making decisions about individual prevention behaviors.

Due to ongoing concerns regarding infectious diseases (COVID-19 and Monkeypox), volunteers will not assist with move-in his fall.

PREPARE FOR WEATHER

BE INFORMED

Review FAMU emergency procedures at emergency.famu.edu. Updates will be communicated through the radio and the emergency notification system.

FILL TANK

In case there is an emergency evacuation, any resident who owns a vehicle should have the gas tank filled.

BUILD A HURRICANE KIT

Recommended supplies are: water, canned food, battery-powered radio, flashlight, matches/lighter, portable charger, first aid kit and cash.

CLEAR REFRIGERATORS & FREEZERS

The items in your refrigerator and freezer may spoil if power is lost.

Students/Parents can enter Bragg Memorial Stadium from Perry Street for staging. An attendant/Officer will direct you to the unloading zone (Polkinghorne Village rear parking lot). Please note that this area is for unloading only. Items should be unloaded, and then the vehicle should be moved to Bragg Stadium or Parking Garage for parking. Someone must always stay with the vehicle during the unloading process. The parking spaces in front of Polkinghorne Village is for ADA unloading only. There is no parking in front of Polkinghorne Village on Gamble Street.

PREFERED TRAVEL ROUTE

Traveling South to Polkinghorne

Go South on Wahnish Way
Turn right onto Robert and Trudie Perkins Way
Turn left onto Perry Street
Turn left into Polkinghorne Village rear parking lot

Traveling North to Polkinghorne

Go North on Wahnish Way
Turn left onto Okaloosa Street
Turn right onto Perry Street
Turn right into Polkinghorne Village rear parking lot

PREFERED TRAVEL ROUTE


Traveling South to Sampson/Young

Go North on Wahnish Way Turn left onto Okaloosa Street Turn right onto Bragg Stadium Service Drive (off Okaloosa Street)




SHUTTLE SERVICE

Two shuttles will be circling around the campus with designated bus stops from 9:00am-5:00pm.

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






FRESHMEN RESIDENCY REQUIREMENT

All First Time In College (FTIC) students shall reside in a university-owned or leased housing facility, based on space availability, for the first academic year of enrollment unless approved for an exception.

EXCEPTIONS TO THE FRESHMEN RESIDENCY REQUIREMENT INCLUDE:

- Students graduated from a high school within thirtyfive (35) miles of the University's Tallahassee campus
- Married students
- Students with a dependent child or children
- Students 21 years of age or older prior to the first day of classes

WHAT MAKES A STUDENT A FTIC?

- A student under the age of 21 prior to the first day of classes.
- Has fewer than 30 semester hours recognized by Florida A&M University.
- Has resided in University on-campus housing for less than two semesters.

THE FOLLOWING STUDENTS SHALL RESIDE IN ON-CAMPUS HOUSING FACILITIES DURING THEIR FIRST TWO YEARS OF ENROLLMENT:

- All student-athletes
- All full University scholarship recipients that receive:
- Presidential Special Scholar
- Life Gets Better
- Adopted High School
- Distinguished Scholars Award
- George W. Gore
- Access Summer Bridge Program and CeDAR ART Program participants shall live in on-campus housing for the first two (2) academic years of enrollment
